

*MLN* Comparative Literature issue welcomes submissions of original articles in all areas of comparative literature. These may include issues of theory, method, interpretation, and the relation of literary studies to philosophy. Articles, which should not exceed 14,000 words (including notes), must be submitted as email attachments in MS Word along with a 100-word abstract. All articles and reviews should be double-spaced and endnote formatted, in accordance with the 8<sup>th</sup> edition of the *MLA Stylebook*.

The deadline for submission to the yearly issue is *March 15th*. Submissions undergo preliminary review by the editorial board. Manuscripts selected for double-blind peer review are sent to at least one anonymous reader. Final decisions on manuscripts are made by the editors on the basis of one or more readers' reports, and may be expected within approximately four months from submission. Articles slated for revision will be returned to the original reader(s) whenever possible following resubmission.

*MLN* Comparative Literature issue only accepts original, article-length submissions. We do not accept "Notes," review essays, or reports. Unsolicited book reviews will be considered on a case by case basis.
